## OUR CHURCH ORGAN

The asbestos contained in the organ (see September's Life-Line) is going to be very expensive to deal with. A consultant has been appointed and, for a start, his fee is likely to be £600. He has obtained tenders from three contractors to deal with the blower & blower box, which are known to be contaminated, and investigate the rest. The cost of this could be £2,780 and if more spots are found it may cost a further £1,000 or more. The removal of the organ complete might be necessary and this would cost the earth, plus a new organ.
