PASTORAL LETTER MAY 2002

In modern popular science books there is a lovely little story which tries to explain the randomness of nature and the unpredictabilty of, shall we say, the weather. It is called the 'Butterfly Effect'. It goes something like this.

In Japan a beautiful butterfly spreads its wings and flies off. As the wings beat up and down the air is slightly disturbed and the disturbances, by some strange quirk of fate, are magnified as the vibrations cross the sea and in a far-off land the result is a typhoon storm. I have always liked that story because it is a parable of the church. Who would have placed bets that the results of the preaching and healing miracles of a few frightened and uneducated men and women in Palestine would have resulted in a world wide faith with billions of believers? Yet it did happen and so when I visit a small village church I have great faith that big things can grow in unlikely circumstances and there are two factors required. The first is, of course, God's action through those who are looking for it and there is secondly the action of the community itself.

As the famous World War 1 poster stated 'Your Country Needs You', so it is equally true that here in West Farleigh your church, All Saints, needs you. In the Bible a saint is not so much a holy person but someone who tries to follow the teaching and the life style of Jesus. Can you be a butterfly for Jesus with the children, the old folk, the choir, the church services and all the other many ways of church life, for that is the way we shall make the difference and perhaps a 'wind of change' will blow though our village too.

Do join us for our Jubilee celebration service and may God bless you all.
